

**The Buck and Doe Run Watershed Partnership** has created a watershed education pamphlet titled "Welcome To Your Watershed" for interested residents in the watersheds. The funding for printing was provided by a PADEP Growing Greener Grant and will be available at your municipal office. "Welcome To Your Watershed" details the watershed boundaries, suggests different, simple conservation practices, additional education resource agencies, and cultural/historical attractions in the region.



It also gives you a glimpse into a new project by the Brandywine Conservancy to create a **Greenway Corridor** along Buck Run. This is an effort to conserve, protect, enhance and preserve the ribbon of green that exists along Buck Run from the Route 30 roadway to its confluence with the Brandywine Creek. *This is not an effort to construct a hard surface.* It is an effort to educate municipalities on the green open space that exists along the creek and to look at different ways to protect the land for wildlife migration and habitat protection, implement water quality improvements with the protection and/or enhancement of forested (or grass) riparian buffers, and soil conservation on adjacent lands.
