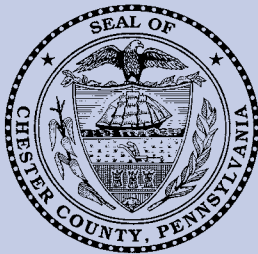

CHRONIC DISEASE and INJURY PREVENTION

- Perform surveillance and treatment applications for mosquito control through the West Nile Virus program

- Childhood lead poisoning prevention program

SEWAGE, WATER & ENVIRONMENTAL MONITORING

- Conduct site evaluations and sewage facilities plan reviews for new subdivisions and land developments
- Permit and inspect individual and community on-lot sewage disposal systems
- License and inspect:
 - Water supply wells
 - Monitoring wells
 - Geothermal wells
 - Well drilling contractors
 - Well pump installers
- License liquid waste haulers and verify disposal locations
- Investigate rental housing complaints

MATERNAL AND CHILD HEALTH

- Well Child Clinic - physical exams, immunizations, growth and development, anemia and lead poisoning prevention counseling and education
- Special Needs Children - referral, follow-up and coordination of care up to age 21
- SIDS - family monitoring and education
- Home Visits - education, referral and follow-up for prenatal and postpartum women and their children

COMMUNICABLE DISEASE CONTROL

- Monitor and investigate communicable diseases
- Response to outbreaks
- Free, confidential testing, counseling and exams for sexually transmitted diseases and HIV/AIDS
- Tuberculosis screening and treatment
