

NEW THIS YEAR FOR ANTERLESS LICENSE:

With the Pennsylvania Automated Licensing System under way, hunters are now able to mail the license application to any county treasurer's office. Hunters may list the top three wildlife management units in which they would like to hunt. Licenses will be sold on a first-come, first-serve basis. If the first priority of the hunter is unavailable, the treasurer's office will try to issue a license in the second or third WMU.

Dates license applications will be accepted are as follows:

By Mail Only:

PA Residents – Anterless License	- July 13, 2009
Non Residents – Anterless License	- July 27, 2009
Unsold Anterless, 1 st Round, one per applicant (Expect for WMU 2B, 5C & 5D)	- August 3, 2009
Unsold Anterless, 2 nd Round, one per applicant (Expect for WMU 2B, 5C & 5D)	- August 17, 2009

Over the Counter Sales:

Anterless License, WMUs 2B, 5C, and 5D	- August 24, 2009
All Other WMUs	- November 2, 2009

PRICE INCREASE:

The Price for hunting licenses will increase by \$0.70 (seventy cents) per license across all licenses. The 70 cents will go directly to the Automated License Center.

OTHER CHANGES:

All licenses mailed in with an incorrect amount will be mailed back to the sender/applicant and they will lose their place in the distribution process (first-come, first-serve). A useful tip for multiple purchases is to include a separate check for each license. In that way, if one application contains an error, or if one check is incorrect, then only one item is returned; not the entire application package.

Hunters are required to furnish their state issued Customer Identification Number (CID) which was received after purchase of their hunting license. Hunters who have not yet purchased their hunting license will be required to provide a valid drivers license and their social security number.
